Conservation

The Safari Park recycles and reclaims the water used in restrooms, streams, fountains, play elements, and animal habitat pools.

You can conserve water at home:

- 1) Plant drought-resistant lawns and shrubs;
- 2) Make sure your home is leak free;
- 3) Install high-efficiency plumbing fixtures.

Protect the environment by allowing plants to grow and by disposing of recyclables and trash in appropriate containers.

For Wildlife Health and Safety

- · Please do not touch or feed any animals or disturb any plant life or habitats.
- · Always stay on marked pathways and in designated areas.
- Photo extension poles or other devices may not be used to cross habitat barriers.
- Entrance into any animal habitat without the consent of an authorized representative of San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance is unlawful under California Penal Code Section 602.13.
- All wildlife care specialists are trained in human/ wildlife interactions. Our care is conducted within the strictest of safety guidelines.

Our Projects

We focus our work in eight conservation hubs, or key regions around the world where we can have the greatest collaborative impact to save and protect wildlife.



We are working with local community partners in Kenya to protect rhinos from poaching and wildlife trafficking, and at our Rhino Rescue Center here in San Diego, we are developing and applying the genetic science needed to save northern white rhinos from extinction.



Elephant

One of the many detrimental effects of elephant poaching is that young calves are left orphaned. We are supporting our partners at the Reteti Elephant Sanctuary in northern Kenya in efforts to rescue, rehabilitate, and rewild these young elephants.



Asia's tigers are among the most endangered animals on Earth, killed for their body parts and because they sometimes come into villages in search of food. We are allying with partners in the regions where tigers live to protect their habitat, and to share education with local communities.



Platypus

Australia is subject to increasing threats from wildfires, much like California. The platypus is one species affected by the resulting habitat loss and droughts that dry up the waterways they depend on. We are aiding partners in assessing and protecting their remaining habitat.

In the Entry Plaza building, Park Base, and the upper deck of the elevator tower.

Family Restrooms

Accessible family restrooms are located near Park Base, at Walkabout Australia, and near Mawazo Kitchen.

Guests with Disabilities

Information is available at Safari Ticket Booths and Park Base. The elevator system provides access to attractions at lower elevations, including Africa Tram, Lion Camp, and African Outpost. For guests with mobility challenges, a courtesy shuttle is available for access.

Lockers

Large and small rental lockers are available on a first-come, first-served basis, just inside the Park entrance.

Park Base

Information, First Aid, Lost & Found, and inquiries regarding public transit and plant identification.

Rentals

Strollers, wheelchairs, and motorized mobility scooters are available for rent on a first-come, first-served basis at Safari Outfitters, just inside the Park entrance.

Safaris

Available at any ticket booth. Advance reservations available online, or call 619-718-3000.

Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.

Vehicle Charging

Four fee-based electric car chargers are available in the guest parking lot on a first-come, first-served basis.
